Market review

The MSCI World Index (USD, NTR) slipped -1.79% in the first quarter of 2025.

During the quarter, at a monthly level, the index moved 3.53% in the month of January, followed by -0.72% in February, and finally closing with -4.45% in March.

Among related benchmarks, during the same period, the MSCI USA Index (USD, NTR) slipped -4.60%, while the MSCI World ex US Index (USD, NTR) gained 6.20%.

Among countries, on a relative basis, stocks in the UK and Germany contributed most positively to benchmark returns, primarily driven by gains from Financials and Industrials sectors. On the flip side, stocks in Denmark and the US contributed most negatively to benchmark returns, primarily driven by challenged performance in Information Technology and Consumer Discretionary sectors.

In terms of size factor, Large caps underperformed Small caps moderately during the period under consideration, led by relative performance in Information Technology and Materials sectors, while in terms of style factors, Value outperformed Growth significantly.

Portfolio review

The Global Small Companies Fund returned -2.43% during the period, outperforming its benchmark, MSCI World Small Cap in AUD (net) (-4.35%), by 192 bps on a net basis.

Among investment themes*, signals within the Themes and Trends pillar contributed most positively to relative returns followed by the suite of signals within High-Quality Business Models, Fundamental Mispricings, and Sentiment Analysis.

Within Themes and Trends, industry momentum factors performed well. These factors aim to identify trending industries that have exhibited strong historical performance. Meanwhile, signals gauging financial quality within the High-Quality Business Models pillar helped relative performance. Additionally, within Fundamental Mispricings, factors evaluating relative valuation added to the relative returns of the portfolio. Finally, hedge fund short sentiment related signals helped the performance of the Sentiment Analysis pillar.

Among sectors, holdings within the Energy sector contributed the most to relative performance, with an underweight position within the Oil, Gas & Consumable Fuels industry contributing particularly strongly. On the downside, holdings within the Utilities sector detracted the most from excess returns, where an underweight position within the Gas Utilities industry hurt relative performance.

At an individual stock level, an overweight position in Hensoldt AG, held primarily due to views around Themes and Trends related factors, performed well. Conversely, an overweight position in United States Lime & Minerals In, held primarily due to views on High-Quality Business Models related factors did not do well.

Among countries, the position in Canada contributed the most to relative performance. Meanwhile, the positioning in UK detracted during the period.


